Each bag approx. 20#dry x 7306 bags=14612 lbs=7.3 tons removed from the lake in five years. Without the removal the plant, it would have multiplied and spread to other areas rendering some spots unusable for humans who use the lake and the ecosystem that supports the wildlife and fish.

Tt will be interesting this year to see what Limpacts there are from a low lake level due to no snow melt or spring precipitation. Normally when the lake is low it allows the sunlight to reach areas on the bottom that do not permit vegetation growth. We will monitor this carefully. We begin prepping for the year in May getting the HIPPO's ready in time enough to provide air tests for the divers prior to commencing their activities in July. In June we plan on a comprehensive vegetation survey to assess the milfoil beds prior to beginning our extraction in July. Our program will run until the end of September. This program relies mostly on the generous support of the lake community and countless volunteers. We thank you for your generous donations above the dues so this program can continue. Below is a summary of the last five years activities.

The milfoil committee welcomes you to contact us at any time with any questions you may have. Keep an eagle eye out for milfoil, know how to identify it, keep the natural vegetation in the water to discourage

the invasive plant from growing in your area. We are hopeful to get to a stage in the lower basin similar to the upper basin where in the past two years we only have needed to re-groom the milfoil beds one week every month. Getting to this stage will reduce the financial demands on all lake residents, reduce the volunteer time needed and preserve our investment allowing us to wake up in the morning and have more time to enjoy the lake.

We got another permit (good for two years) to continue reclaiming the sand from the lower narrows and putting it back on Dr. Davies beach. This year (just like previous years) a lot of the sand we dredged, filtered back into the lake settling in the narrows. Our plan is to start the reclamation project in late

May or early June to have the narrows fully open with enough depth to keep our boat motors from dragging in sand. Our sand dredge (recently renamed to the Sand Piper) did a great job for us last year so we expect it will perform equally well this season.


In 2010, the Little Sebago Lake Association established an endowment fund. The endowment fund was created, and accounts were set up to help provide for the long term health and protection of Little Sebago Lake. 

Normal winter?
As I write this report on
April 13, 2012 I am reminded that on
the same date one year ago Little
Sebago Lake was still ice covered, the
lake had already risen to 8 inch's above
our summer level, and we still had 8
inch's plus of snow on the ground. The
official "Ice Out" date for this year was
March 23, 2012, over 4 weeks ahead of
last year!

The Dam on Little Sebago Lake was closed 3 weeks ahead of the April 15th scheduled date because of the lack of rain or snow. We are on this date still down 12 inch's in level with no signs of a change in the weather pattern. The low water mark for 2012 is the current reading of 288.1 or -13".

The dam is in good structural condition, all the granite is in place and no movement

or cracks in the mortar can be detected. The oak seals on the spillway floor and bottom of the draw are about 75% determinate and will be replaced, hopefully this year. Finding a contractor to do the work is an issue, the actual cost of material is very minor compared to the labor of building a coffer dam in February when the water level is at its lowest. I hope to have cost estimate in time for the July 14th Aimhi meeting.

The Emergency Action Plan was submitted and accepted last year; it has a two year life so no action planned for this year. The dam committee will meet in July to fulfill the state EAP review requirements.

Display your decal with Pride!






Follow-Up Erosion Survey and End of Little Sebago Lake Conservation Project

The third and final phase of the Little Sebago Lake Conservation Project will be wrapping up this summer. In completing this project, a follow-up survey will be conducted to determine potential remaining sites for LSLA to focus on. This follow-up survey will be conducted from May through August. Volunteers will be reviewing sites originally identified in the 2002 and 2003 surveys. The surveys identified areas in which pollution (particularly erosion) was washing into the lake. A review will determine if these issues are still present. Since these surveys, over \$282,584.00 in grant funds have been leveraged to address 76 high priority sites!

This follow-up survey is a non-regulatory effort to gather information to protect and improve the water quality of Little Sebago Lake. Postcards will be mailed to all affected landowners. 


